PRESS STATEMENT

MITI DATABASE SYSTEM – CIMS – AS RMP REFERENCE IN STATES UNDERGOING CMCO AND EMCO

Following the announcement of the Conditional Movement Control Order (CMCO) and Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) in several locations nationwide, the Ministry of International Trade & Industry (MITI) wishes to call upon all companies in Malaysia to register on the business database system called the COVID-19 Intelligent Management System (CIMS).

Registration is to ease inspections made by the Royal Malaysian Police (RMP) who will be using this system as their reference point before authority to operate will be given to the relevant companies.

However, MITI wishes to emphasize that registration on CIMS will only serve as reference for the RMP and **does not constitute approval to operate** on an automatic basis for companies. Approval to operate is still subject to the decision of the RMP.

As for the CMCO locations in Sabah, companies from the Essential Service sectors as gazetted by the Government are strongly encouraged to register on CIMS. The list of these sectors can be referred to on the National Security Council website.

Companies can register online through the link <http://notification.miti.gov.my>. Companies which have registered on previous versions of CIMS do not need to apply again. Companies facing any technical issues with registration can send a feedback email to info@marij.my or contact MITI on MITI's social media platforms on Twitter, Facebook and Instagram.

Additionally, MITI wishes to remind companies which are approved to operate to comply with the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) set for each involved sector. This is in line with the undertaking given by companies when making an application on CIMS. Compliance is also mandatory to ensure the safety and health of employees is always maintained.

Non-compliance to the SOPs constitute a criminal offence under Rule 7 of the Prevention and Control of Infectious Diseases (Measures Within Infected Local Areas) Regulations 2020 and companies can face legal action.
