ACTIVITY AND PROTOCOL

Activity	Brief Description
Areas Involved	Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur, Federal Territory of Putrajaya and Selangor
Effective Period	14 October 2020 (from 12.01am) until 27 October 2020 (11.59pm)
Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Royal Malaysian Police (PDRM) is responsible for controlling infectious areas with the assistance of the Malaysian Armed Forces (ATM), Malaysia Civil Defence Force (APM) and the People's Volunteer Corps (RELA). • Only two people are allowed to leave the house for the purpose of obtaining food supplies / basic necessities, medication and other necessities. High risk individuals and children are not encouraged to go out to public, open and congested areas. • Vehicles transporting essential goods and services and the economic / industrial supply chain are permitted to enter and exit. The number of people allowed inside the vehicle is dependent on the commercial vehicle registration license. • Activities and services at all airport and ports are allowed to operate. • Individuals taking flights through KLIA, KLIA2 and Subang must also first obtain approval from PDRM. • Public transportation services such as bus stops, express buses, LRT/MRT/ERL/monorail and taxi / e-hailing services are allowed to operate. • Taxi / e-hailing services, (with a maximum of 2 passengers) and food delivery are allowed to operate from 6.00am to 12.00 midnight for the duration of the CMCO. • Emergency cases such as illnesses and funeral arrangements outside the district is permitted but an application must be made to PDRM. • Any individual originating from a CMCO area is allowed to return to it with the permission of PDRM.

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Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Necessary movement through the State of Selangor, the Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur and the Federal Territory of Putrajaya to other states is permitted and permission must be obtained from the nearest police station before traveling. • Movement to EMCO areas are based on Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) SOPs.
Activities Within the CMCO Area	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All business, economic and industrial activities may operate as determined by the Government. • Supermarkets, shopping malls and retail stores can operate according to the prescribed SOPs. • Restaurants, shops / dining outlets, food trucks, roadside hawkers, mobile hawkers, food court / hawker centres, roadside stalls / kiosks, grocery and convenience stores can operate between 6.00 am to 10.00pm. • The purchase of food is encouraged by drive-through, delivery or take-away only. Dining in is permitted and is limited to 2 people per table with compliance with the Food & Beverage Sector SOP. • Day market operations are between 6.00am to 2.00pm only. • Wholesale market operations are between 4.00am to 2.00pm only. • Wet market operations are between 6.00am to 12.00 noon with compliance to the SOP and under the supervision of RELA officers. • Night market operations are between 4.00pm to 10.00pm with compliance to the SOP and under the supervision of RELA officers. • Petrol station operating hours are between 6.00am to 10.00pm (except for the operation of petrol stations on highways which can operate 24 hours)



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Medical / Health Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Government and private clinics and hospitals are allowed to operate 24 hours. • Pharmacies and drug stores can operate from 8.00am to 11.00pm.
Physical Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure the movement of customers in and out of the premises is with 1 meter physical distancing. • Limit the number of customers on the premises at any given time and display the maximum number of customers on the premises.
Employment Activity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cross-district movement is not permitted. Only employees with a valid employee pass OR an approval letter from the employer is permitted for employment purposes and to carry out their duty. • Employees crossing states into a CMCO area is permitted by showing an employee pass OR an approval letter from the employer. • Employers must comply with this order and encourage employees to work from home for activities that can be carried out from home. • Vehicles carrying employees are permitted to operate with adherence to the SOP.

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Economic and Industrial Sector Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Economic and industrial sector activities in CMCO areas can operate as determined with compliance to prescribed SOPs. • All industrial, business and manufacturing related vehicles can operate including crossing districts and states.
Fisheries, Plantation and Agriculture Sectors	The fisheries, plantation, agriculture and livestock and all other sectors related to the food supply chain can operate.
Other Permitted Activities	Other activities not listed in the List of Unauthorized Activities are allowed based on existing SOPs which have been set.

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Activity	Brief Description
List of Unauthorized Activities (Negative List)	
Religious Activities	All religious activities at mosques, <i>suraus</i> , and non-Muslim houses of worship are not permitted. Mosques and <i>suraus</i> are only allowed to sound the call for prayer and carry out the five daily prayers with the attendance of 6 congregants as determined by the Mosque Committee including the <i>Imam</i> . <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Management and staff in all non-Muslim houses of worship is allowed for 6 people only. • Friday Prayers are subject to the State Religious Authority.
Entertainment and Cultural Activities	Entertainment and cultural activities are not allowed. Entertainment activities such as nightclubs or pubs, theme parks, indoor playgrounds and cinemas are not allowed.
Sports and Recreational Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Non-contact sports and recreational activities and carried out individually not exceeding 10 people such as e-sports, walking, jogging, cycling, aerobics, hiking, fishing and other outdoor activities are permitted. • Indoor activities, picnics, swimming pool activities, contact / combat sports, team sport matches and the organizing of tournaments / competitions are not allowed. • Sports events and competitions in the presence of spectators, and sports events and competitions involving participants from other states are not allowed. • Centralized training programs currently run by the National Sports Council and the State Sports Councils can be continued with a Quarantine Based Approach as implemented in the National Sports Complex in Bukit Jalil and Keramat, the Malaysian Badminton Academy in Bukit Kiara and the Paralympic Sports Centre of Excellence in Kg. Pandan.

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Seminars / Workshops / Conferences / Exhibitions	All Seminars / Workshops / Courses / Training Sessions / Conferences / Talks / Exhibitions and activities related to Meeting, Incentives, Conventions and Exhibitions (MICE) are not allowed. Ongoing civil service training can only be carried out within the institution training area.
Meetings	Face-to-face meetings are not encouraged. Meetings should be held via video conference.
Mass Ceremonies	Government and Private Official and Informal Ceremonies, Social Events such as ceremonies, weddings and engagements, <i>aqiqah</i> ceremonies, <i>doa selamat</i> , <i>tahlil</i> , anniversaries, birthday celebrations, reunions and other social gatherings are not allowed.
Tourist Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All tourist activities involving leaving the CMCO area and entering the CMCO area are not allowed. • Out of state tourist activities by citizens and domestic tourism involving foreign tourists entering Malaysia except for foreign tourists as determined by the Minister.
Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public and Private Higher Education Institutes, Vocational Training Centres, schools, kindergartens, nurseries, <i>tahfiz</i> centres and day-care centres are closed during this period. • School, IPTA, IPTS students sitting for examinations with foreign educational institutions can attend solely to sit for exams and not for learning sessions.
Other Unauthorized Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any activity that can cause many people to attend in one place, making it difficult to conduct physical distancing and comply with the orders by the Director-General of Health. • Other matters decided by the Government from time to time.
