KUALA LUMPUR, SABAH, SELANGOR (EXCEPT FOR THE DISTRICTS OF SABAK BERNAM, HULU SELANGOR AND KUALA SELANGOR), PENANG (MUKIM 12: BARAT DAYA AND MUKIM 13: TIMUR LAUT), PERAK (MUKIM HULU KINTA: IPOH & CHEMOR AREAS) NEGERI SEMBILAN (SEREMBAN AND PORT DICKSON DISTRICTS), AND JOHOR (JOHOR BAHRU, BATU PAHAT AND KULAI DISTRICTS) *For Sabah, please refer to the CMCO SOP for the entire State of Sabah

Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Movement within and into CMCO areas and other Recovery Movement Control Order (RMCO) areas is <b>ALLOWED</b></li> <li>• Movement to Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) areas require the <b>PERMISSION</b> of PDRM.</li> <li>• <b>The number of passengers in private vehicles is in accordance with the vehicle's capacity.</b> However, high risk individuals and children are not encouraged to go out to public, open and congested areas.</li> <li>• The number of people permitted in vehicles transporting essential goods and services and the economic / industrial supply chain is dependent on the commercial vehicle registration license.</li> <li>• The movement of private, Government department or private company vehicles <b>for the purpose of traveling to and from work</b> or to conduct official government business is dependent on the seating capacity of the vehicle.</li> <li>• Activities and services at all airports and ports are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate.</li> <li>• Public transportation services such as bus stops, express buses, LRT/MRT/ERL/monorail, ferries, airplanes, taxi / e-hailing services and other public transportation are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate (operational hours in accordance with license terms) based on the capacity of the vehicle.</li> <li>• Food delivery services are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate from 6.00am to 12.00 midnight for the duration of the CMCO.</li> </ul>

Movement Control at Sea	<p><b>Sabah</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The movement of small boats from the island of Sabah to the mainland including the movement of boats in the coastal area are only <b>ALLOWED</b> with the capacity of 50% from 6.00 am to 6.00 pm only.</li> <li>• For fishing boats in ESSZONE waters registered with the Fisheries Department, they are only <b>ALLOWED</b> from 6.00 am to 6.00 pm (only at permitted jetties). This permission is subject to the permit issued by the District Chief Police.</li> <li>• Movement of the following ships are <b>NOT ALLOWED</b> for:                         <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) All Non-Convention Ships (NCS) Indonesia and the Philippines entering the ESSZONE, Sabah and Malaysian waters. All NCS Malaysia ships from ESSZONE waters to the Philippines and Indonesia;</li> <li>b) Indonesian fish carriers to Tawau; and</li> <li>c) NCS ships from the Philippines passing through Sabah waters to F.T. Labuan.</li> </ol> </li> </ul> <p>Note: All NCS ships are small vessels under international shipping standards (International Maritime Organization Standard)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All scuba diving activities are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate with a capacity of 50% passengers for boats carrying divers to dive locations with a capacity of 50% on-site with compliance with the SOP as set by the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and the Environment of Sabah. However, this activity is <b>NOT ALLOWED</b> in localities under the EMCO.</li> </ul>

Movement Control at Sea	<p><b>Labuan</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sign-On / Sign-Off movements by the shipping as well as the oil and gas industry is <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate in accordance with the current regulations and SOPs in force. <b>Entry from Red Zones at sea and air entrances for a Sign-On must be accompanied with negative COVID-19 test results three (3) days from the date of entry and mandatory quarantine of 14 days must be carried out before a Sign-On.</b></li> <li>• Water transport services for RoRo Ferries, Express Ferries and Speed Boats are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate with limited capacity based on physical distancing from <b>6.00 am to 10.00 pm</b>.</li> <li>• Water taxis, <i>penambang</i> and steering transport services are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm <b>except for Sign-Off activities.</b></li> <li>• Transportation services for <b>Sign-Off activities are only ALLOWED to operate from 6.00 am to 6.00 pm with compliance with the current regulations and SOPs in force.</b></li> <li>• NCS Ship Activities (Kumpit) to Labuan for transshipment purposes are <b>NOT ALLOWED.</b></li> <li>• For ships coming from Sabah, Sarawak and outside the waters of F.T. Labuan into F.T. Labuan in the span of 14 days, crews conducting the Sign-Off must undergo mandatory quarantine for 14 days.</li> </ul>

Activities in CMCO areas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Business / economic / industrial activities are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate as determined by the Government.</li> <li>• Supermarkets, shopping malls and retail stores are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate according to the prescribed SOPs between 6.00 am to 12.00 am.</li> <li>• Restaurants, shops / dining outlets, food trucks, roadside hawkers, mobile hawkers, food court / hawker centres, roadside stalls / kiosks, grocery and convenience stores are <b>ALLOWED</b> to between 6.00 am to 12.00 am with compliance to the Food Sector SOP.</li> <li>• Restaurants and eateries are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate on a <i>dine-in</i> basis (<b>WITH DISTANCING OF 1 METER BETWEEN CUSTOMERS in accordance with table size</b>), take-away, delivery or drive-through with compliance to the <b>Food Sector SOP (Premised Businesses, Non-Premised Hawkers, Indoor Markets and Retail / Convenience Stores)</b>. Operational hours are allowed from 6.00 am to 12.00 am (subject to license terms).</li> <li>• Day markets, wholesale markets, wet markets, night markets and Late Night Markets (uptown, downtown and the like) are in accordance with the starting operational hours set by the license / permit until 12.00 am with compliance to the SOP and supervision by the authorities as well as RELA / Local Authority personnel.</li> <li>• Petrol station operating hours are between 6.00 am to 12.00 am (except for the operation of petrol stations on highways which can operate 24 hours).</li> <li>• Laundry services are <b>ALLOWED</b> from 6.00am to 12.00 am.</li> <li>• Other business operations for daily needs are <b>ALLOWED</b> from 6.00am to 12.00 am (subject to license terms).</li> </ul>

Medical / Health Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Government and private clinics and hospitals are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate on a 24-hour basis or in accordance with hours set by the Government.</li> <li>• Pharmacies and drug stores can operate from 8.00 am to 12.00 am.</li> </ul>				
Health Protocols	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The premise owner to ensure the movement of customers in and out of the premises is with 1-meter physical distancing.</li> <li>• The premise owner to ensure customers check-in to the premises using MySejahtera or to manually write down their name and contact number as well as to scan their body temperature. A body temperature of 37.5 degree Celsius and above is <b>NOT ALLOWED</b> to enter the premises.</li> <li>• The premise owner to limit the number of customers in the premises with a 1-meter radius physical distancing at any given time and to display the maximum number of customers within the premises.</li> <li>• Employees, suppliers and customers are required to wear face masks correctly in accordance with MOH recommendations while on the premises.</li> <li>• <b>Mandatory wearing of face masks while in congested areas.</b></li> </ul>				
Employment Activity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Movement in and out of <b>CMCO</b> and <b>RMCO</b> areas is <b>ALLOWED</b>.</li> <li>• Movement into EMCO areas <b>IS NOT ALLOWED</b>.</li> <li>• Employment activities based on JPA Circulars / Orders for civil servants and Employers for private sector employees.</li> <li>• Vehicles carrying employees including private vehicles are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate with SOP compliance.</li> </ul>

Sports and Recreational Activities		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Non-contact sports and recreational activities (indoor and outdoor) are allowed. Activities carried out individually must not exceed 10 people while ensuring social distancing (static activities: 1 – 3 meters and dynamic activities: 3 – 5 meters) such as walking, jogging, cycling, aerobics, hiking, fishing and others are <b>ALLOWED</b> with compliance to the Sports and Recreation Sector SOP.</li> <li>• Permission to operate and use sports facilities by the public is <b>RESTRICTED</b> to <b>training activities</b> which do not involve physical contact and with compliance to the Sports and Recreation SOP. Usage capacity for every premise involved must not exceed 50% of the entire capacity of the premises. The sports organizer and operator must schedule training if there are many participants by limiting the number at any given time.</li> <li>• Centralized training programs currently run by the National Sports Council and the State Sports Councils can be continued with a “Quarantine Based Approach” as implemented in the National Sports Complex in Bukit Jalil and Keramat, the Malaysian Badminton Academy in Bukit Kiara and the Paralympic Sports Centre of Excellence in Kg. Pandan and the Velodrome in Nilai.</li> </ul>

Economic and Industrial Sector Activities		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Economic and industrial sector activities in CMCO areas can operate as determined by the Government with compliance to prescribed SOPs.</li> <li>• All industrial, business and manufacturing related vehicles are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate, including to cross districts and states.</li> </ul>			
Fisheries, Plantation and Agriculture Sectors		The fisheries, plantation, agriculture and livestock and all other sectors related to the food supply chain are <b>ALLOWED</b> to operate.			
Religious Activities		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Activities in the mosques and <i>suraus</i> are <b>ALLOWED</b> with restricted attendance as determined by the State Religious Authority.</li> <li>• Activities in non-Muslim houses of worship are <b>ALLOWED</b> with restricted attendance as determined by the NSC / MOH / State Government and the Ministry of Federal Territories for worship houses in the Federal Territories.</li> <li>• Islamic wedding ceremonies (<i>akad nikah</i>) are <b>ALLOWED</b> with the maximum presence of 30 people based on the available space and physical distancing at the Religious office or subject to the number set by the State Religious Authority.</li> <li>• Non-Muslim wedding ceremonies are <b>ALLOWED</b> with the maximum presence of 30 people based on the available space and physical distancing at the National Registration Department / House of Worship / Non-Muslim Religious Association.</li> </ul>

Creative Industries		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Recording activities for music, concerts, filming, interviews and the like are <b>ALLOWED</b> either in-house (at a studio) or at external premises but <b>RESTRICTED</b> to within <b>CMCO</b> areas only with a minimal number of crew and <b>WITHOUT AN AUDIENCE</b> as well as with compliance to the Creative Industry SOP.</li> <li>• Live event activities without spectators are allowed with the number of crew and staff as set by the <b>Ministry of Communications and Multimedia (KKMM)</b>.</li> <li>• Busking activities in enclosed locations (within buildings) are <b>ALLOWED</b> with control in performance timing and the number of spectators as set by <b>KKMM</b>.</li> </ul>			
Day Care Centres, <i>Tabika</i> , Kindergartens and Nurseries		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Day care centres, <i>tabikas</i>, kindergartens and nurseries are allowed to operate with permission to operate by the relevant Ministry / Agency.</li> <li>• Parents / guardians sending their children to day care centres are allowed to use vehicles with a number of child passengers according to the capacity of the vehicle.</li> </ul>

MICE (Meetings, Incentives, Conventions and Exhibitions)		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Business events in relation to meetings, incentives, conventions and exhibitions are allowed to operate at <b>50% of the premise capacity</b> with compliance to social distancing, mandatory wearing of face masks and based on the MICE CMCO SOP.</li> </ul>			
Tourist and Cultural Activities		<p>The following activities are allowed to operate at <b>50% of the premise capacity</b> with compliance to social distancing, mandatory wearing of face masks and based on the relevant CMCO SOPs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Public tourist attractions such as zoos, farms, aquariums, edutainment centers, recreational parks, extreme / adventure / nature parks and others;</li> <li>• Arts, culture and heritage premises such as museums, libraries, art galleries, cultural heritage villages / centers, cultural performance stages and others;</li> <li>• Theme parks and family entertainment centers.</li> </ul> <p>Other tourist and cultural activities OTHER THAN those listed under the Negative List are subject to the available Cultural and Tourism CMCO SOP which is currently in force.</p>			
Meetings		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Face-to-face meetings for official business / work held at the office, hotel and other institutions is allowed with compliance to social distancing, mandatory face masks and only at 50% of the meeting room capacity.</li> </ul>

		Seminars / Workshops / Conferences / Exhibitions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All Seminars / Workshops / Courses / Training Sessions / Conferences / Talks are allowed to operate at <b>50% of the premise capacity</b> with compliance to social distancing, mandatory wearing of face masks and based on the General SOP for the Execution of Official Government and Private Events.</li> <li>• Ongoing service training <b>CAN BE CARRIED OUT</b> only within the training institution area.</li> </ul>		
		Mass Ceremonies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Government and Private Official and Non-Official Events, Social Events such as ceremonies, weddings and engagements, <i>aqiqah</i> ceremonies, <i>doa selamat</i>, <i>tahlil</i>, anniversaries, birthday celebrations, reunions and other social gatherings are allowed to operate at <b>50% of the premise capacity</b> with compliance to social distancing, mandatory wearing of face masks and based on the General SOP for the Execution of Social Events.</li> </ul>		
		Other Permitted Activities	Other activities not listed in the Negative List are <b>ALLOWED</b> based on existing SOPs which have been prescribed.

Entertainment Activities		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Activities in nightclubs or pubs.</li> <li>• <b>Activities in cinemas except for those in green zones within RMCO areas which are permitted to carry out such activities.</b></li> <li>• Concerts or live events with spectators.</li> </ul>			
Education		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tuition, music classes, dance classes, arts, recitation, language classes and the like. <b>EXCEPTION IS GIVEN</b> for individual (one-to-one) classes. These activities are allowed as usual in green zones within RMCO areas.</li> <li>• <b>EXCEPTION.</b> School, IPTA, IPTS students sitting for examinations with foreign educational institutions are <b>ALLOWED</b> to attend solely to sit for exams and not for learning sessions.</li> </ul>			
Sports and Recreational Activities		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Picnic activities, physical contact activities / combat sports, matches for team sports and tournament / competition activities.</li> <li>• Sports and recreational activities that involve many people and physical distancing would be difficult to control.</li> <li>• Sports events and competitions with spectators, and sports events and competitions involving foreign participants.</li> </ul>

Other Unauthorized Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any activity that can cause many people to attend in one place, making it difficult to conduct physical distancing and comply with orders by the Director-General of Health.</li> <li>• Others as decided by the Government from time to time.</li> </ul>
