**Implementation of Corporate Liability Provisions  
Effective on June 1, 2020**

The government is committed to fighting corruption, improving integrity and good governance.

It doesn't matter if the venture is implemented at the government department level, the private sector and even civil society, this effort will continue to be given priority.

As everyone may know, the reporting provisions within Section 17A of the MACC Act 2009 on May 4, 2018 has stipulated the implementation of the Corporate Liability Principle involving commercial organizations.

This provision stipulates that it is an offense for commercial organizations found to have any employee or party associated with the organization involved with corruption for the benefit of the organization.

After considering the current situation and the views of all parties, the government stipulates that the implementation of the Corporate Liability Principle remains in effect from June 1, 2020.

Among other things, this enforcement can encourage commercial organizations to take appropriate and consistent steps to ensure its business is not involved in corruption activities that are self-serving.
