#### IT Volunteer Brings Tech-to Remote Schools

In his more than 30-year career as an information technology (IT) professional in the tech and aerospace industries, John Cartwright found his true passion while volunteering his IT knowledge and skills to help underserved communities around the globe, bringing education to children in remote and sometimes devastated parts of the world. It began in 2011 with a trip to earthquake-shattered Haiti, Cartwright helped install a computer lab in L'Ecole de Choix, a new elementary school in Mirebalais.

He then started his own nonprofit, Just Learning Opportunities, dedicated to providing opportunities for youth through educational technologies. Though Cartwright retired from Intel in 2016, he continues to partner with IESC efforts through Just Learning Opportunities. Through this volunteer work, he felt the ability to provide children with opportunities they wouldn't otherwise have.
